

Ukulele Lesson Two C and E Strings

TAB 0 2 0 2 | 0 0 0 0 | 0 2 0 2 | 0 0 2 0

This number two on the TAB staff above means put the finger in the second fret on the neck. I have put a white single spot there where you need to put your finger for D



If you also use the open E string too you can play 'Merrily We Roll Along'

On the E string the white number one spot is the note F
and the white number 2 spot is the note G.

On the TAB line the 0 is an open string,

the 1 is place finger in the 1st fret (spot number 1 on the picture)
the 3 is place finger in the 3rd fret (spot number 3 on the picture)

Try the above exercise which is just on the E string.



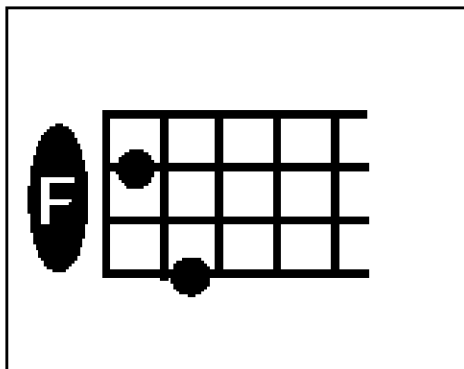
When you are happy with this try the exercise below using the C and notes on the D string and the E string with notes F and G

Chord of F



On the chord chart to the left the strings go from left to right

The lines going from the top to the bottom are called FRET WIRES

The spaces in between are called FRETS This large picture shows the chord of F.

The small box shows the chord box for F

The spot is your finger, I would use finger 1 and 2 for now.

This tune below is the start of Twinkle Twinkle Little Star with a little 'fudge' at the end as we have not looked at G yet.
